

MILLARVILLE COMMUNITY LIBRARY

In 1975, the Millarville Community Library's humble beginnings consisted of one bay of shelves in the school library in the basement of Millarville School. It was entirely run by volunteers and to this day continues to be staffed by many volunteers along with a librarian employee.

In 1977 an addition was built on to the school, and the community library moved upstairs as part of the new school library. As it grew, it was moved into the Ancillary Room (present day staff room) and shared the space with the grade five classroom. Due to increased school enrolment in the late 1980's the library needed to find a new home.

Much fundraising was done and on May 28, 1992, Millarville Community Library officially opened its doors on the west side of the school. It was now a member of the Marigold Library System which enables patrons to access inter-library loans from other libraries in the province. The library also showcases all kinds of artwork, sponsors classes in arts & crafts and music, and hosts many functions throughout the year such as Story Time, Author visits, Science Week, Harry Potter festivities, Summer Reading Program, and an annual book club gathering of the dozen book clubs in the Millarville area.
