THE WOLLEY-DOD ERA

1893 TO 1917



FREDERICK HOVA WOLLEY-DOD

- Born 1872 in Eton, Buckinghamshire, England
- Western Canada Entomologist 1893-1915
- Lieutenant in King's Own Yorkshire Light Infantry
- Died 1919 in Turkey, aged 47



WOLLEY-DOD BUILT THE HOUSE WITH MODERN CONVENIENCES IN 1912

- Spring water running through the basement for refrigeration
- Modern porcelain bathroom fixtures upstairs
- 300 gallon water tank in attic to supply kitchen and bathroom
- Hot air engine/steam engine to send water up to the attic
- Carbide light fixtures on main floor supplied by acetylene gas generator in attic





Lycaena hypophlaeas arethusa (Wolley-Dod, 1907) (American Copper)











- Wolley-Dod hired an assistant, W.H.T. Tams in 1912.
- He collected 60 undescribed species of Lepidoptera around his home.
- Dod joined the army in 1917. He hoped to collect butterflies in Macedonia, but sadly died of dysentery in Macedonia in 1919.
- Tams returned to Britain in 1917 and became the curator of Lepidoptera at the British Museum.
- Several species of Lepidoptera are named after F.H.
 Wolley-Dod.
- When Wolley-Dod died in 1919, the Royal Ontario Museum sent out a truck to retrieve his collection of 20,000 butterflies.

ALEXANDER MACKLIN

- Born in India where his father was a doctor.
- Moved to the Scilly Isles
- Became a doctor.
- Played for the Manchester Rugby Club
- Joined the Shackleton Imperial Trans-Antarctic Expedition
- Became one of the best dog sled drivers on the expedition
























































Dr. Alexander Macklin visited Shackleton in his cabin and, after encouraging him to take things easy, was rebuked with the words:

"You always want me to give up something. What do you want me to give up now?"

This was the last thing Shackleton said. He died quite suddenly at the age of 47.




























BATS

BROWN BATS IN ALBERTA




